TCNJ Class of 2013 First Year Out Survey Report

August 1, 2014

Dear Members of the TCNJ Campus Community:

The following is a report detailing the post-graduation activity of the Class of 2013. Individuals who completed a degree at TCNJ in August 2012, December 2012 and May 2013 were contacted to complete the survey in a variety of methods (electronically, telephone and U.S. mail).

Of the 1460 graduates surveyed 679 or (47%) responded. Though this response rate continues to decrease, all outreach methods were used. In addition, data was obtained from the Center for Institutional Effectiveness, the School of Business exit survey, School of Engineering exit survey, School of The Arts & Communication exit survey and National Admissions Clearinghouse service. The combination yielded 856 (59%) survey participants.

To provide you with a full picture of what has happened to our graduates, information has been analyzed overall and by school. Data includes employment, graduate/professional school and salary. We collected employment and graduate school data on 793 of the graduates. Of them, 735 (93%) indicated they were either working and/or attending graduate school in the first year after graduation. This is a 7% decrease from 2012 and can be attributed to a decrease in the amount of respondents as well as a change in the survey providing less comparable statistics. The survey continues to go under review with the possibility of moving employment and graduate school questions to the beginning of the survey.

A special thanks go to the academic departments, and student staff- Sally Milnes (CE Intern), Bridget Anton and Johnathan Eldis for their contribution to this process. In addition I appreciate the input from the members of the Learning Community, Facilitating Student Outcomes Assessment led by Dr. Jean Kirnan, which will prove valuable in years to come. It is through collaborative efforts that we are all able to achieve our greatest successes.

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TCNJ Class of 2013 Survey Excerpts

Post-Graduation Activity Summary

679 (47%) graduates responded to the survey. In an effort to respond to declining response rates, the Career Center incorporated data obtained through immediate response surveys from the School of Business, the School of Engineering, the School of the Arts & Communication and data from the Admissions Clearinghouse. Incorporating these sources, data was obtained on a total of 856 (57%) graduates.

We collected employment and graduate school data on 793 of the graduates. Of them, 735 (93%) indicated they were either working and/or attending graduate school in the first year after graduation.

Experiential Learning/Internships

Of the 679 survey respondents, 408 (60%) indicated whether they had or had not participated in an experiential learning/internship experience during their undergraduate careers at TCNJ. Of those 408 students, 196 (48%) indicated that they had participated in an internship for at least one semester. Of those 196 students, 116 (59%) indicated that they had participated in internships for two or more semesters, with an average of approximately 2 semesters per student. Of the 196 students that participated in at least one internship, 60 (31%) indicated that their internship experience secured them a job after graduation.

Additionally, 88 (22%) participated in student teaching, with 28 participating in two or more semesters. 26 (6%) participated in clinical placements, with 22 participating in two or more semesters. 19 (5%) participated in MUSE research, with 3 participating in two or more semesters. 91 (22%) participated in TCNJ sponsored research, with 59 participating in two or more semesters. 35 (9%) participated in non-TCNJ sponsored research, with 9 participating in two or more semesters.

TCNJ Career Preparation & Graduate Expectations

Of 434 employed graduates, 283 (65%) rated how well they felt TCNJ prepared them for their careers. 93% rated their preparedness between Average and Excellent, and 66% rated their preparedness between Above Average and Excellent.

Of the 679 survey respondents, 422 (62%) indicated that they had received post-graduation advice from their faculty advisors. Of those 422, 85% received advice regarding internships, 77% received advice regarding career plans and 76% received advice regarding graduate/professional school. 422 (62%) also indicated that they had utilized one or more services provided by the Career Center. 74% indicated that they were Satisfied or Very Satisfied with the Resume Critique service offered by the Career Center.

Graduate School Summary

Of the 679 survey respondents, 165 (24%) indicated they attended graduate school within the first year. Through the Clearinghouse we learned that an additional 177 graduates attended graduate school within the first year, giving us a total of 342 students in graduate school (23% of the total graduating class). Class of 2013

In an effort to respond to declining response rates, the Career Center incorporated data obtained through immediate response surveys from the School of Business, the School of Engineering, and the Center for Institutional Effectiveness. Out of 1,348 graduates, 679 (50%) responded to the surveys. The Admissions Clearinghouse was able to identify an additional 177 graduates from the class that pursued further study in their first year after graduation. Therefore, a total of 856 (64%) students' information was obtained. Including Clearinghouse data, we have graduate school and employment information for 793 graduates. 735 (93%) of those graduates are working and/or attending graduate school.

Graduating Class by Academic School

Of the graduating class:

59 (45%) Arts & Communication graduates responded to the survey; The Clearinghouse provided information on an additional 9 graduates.

237 (88%) Business graduates responded to the survey; The Clearinghonse provided information on an additional 6 graduates.

76 (33%) Education graduates responded to the survey; The Clearinghouse provided information on an additional 32 graduates

83 (66%) Engineering graduates responded to the survey; The Clearinghouse provided information on an additional 6 graduates

117 (39%) Hum. & Soc. Sciences graduates responded to the survey; The Clearinghouse provided information on an additional 77 graduates.

30 (28%) Nursing & Ex. Science graduates responded to the survey; The Clearinghouse provided information on an additional 9 graduates.

67 (30%) Science graduates responded to the survey. The Clearinghonse provided information on an additional 38 graduates.

5 (56%) Self-Designed major graduates responded to the survey.

POST GRADUATION ACTIVITY

We collected employment and graduate school data on 793 of the graduates. Of them, 735 (93%) indicated they were either working and/or attending graduate school in the first year after graduation.

Employment

Of the 679 survey respondents, 645 provided us with employment information. Of them, 434 (67%) indicated they were working in the first year after graduation. 211 indicated that they were not employed, but of them, 107 (51%) were either attending graduate school or considering attending.

Of the 434 employed graduates:

244 (56%) specified that they were employed full time. Of them, 208 were not seeking further employment.

46 (11%) specified that they were employed part time. Of them, 24 were not seeking further employment.

144 (33%) students did not specify whether they were working part time or full time.

Of the 104 truly unemployed (not actively working or attending graduate school), 22 (21%) indicated that they were either searching for jobs or had plans to attend graduate school in the future.

Fields of Employment

Students pursue occupations in a variety of career fields. Of the 244 full-time employed students, 243 (99%) indicated that they worked in the following fields:

Average Salaries

Of the 244 graduates who indicated that they are currently employed full time, 243 (99%) provided their salary information.

All salary information is calculated based on student responses to a range of salary values from \$19,999 and less to \$85,000 and more. The range utilizes \$5,000 intervals.

The average reported salary for the respondents was \$46,328. This is close to but slightly higher than the Class of 2012 reported average of \$45,768.

Further analysis compared average income ranges for male and female graduates working full time. An independent samples t-test showed that male graduates' average salaries fell within the 45,000-49,999 range while female graduates' salaries fell within the 40,000-44,999 range (significance: p < .01). *See Appendix A for further salary breakdowns.

Work Loeations

Of the 244 graduates that work full time, 244 (100%) provided the location of their employment. The top states for work location were New Jersey with 187 (77%) graduates, New York with 24 (10%) graduates, and Pennsylvania with 10 (4%) graduates. The 23 remaining graduates are working in the following locations, 3 of which are outside of the country: California (3), Delaware (4), Florida (2), Louisiana (1), Maryland (3), Massachusetts (1), New Mexico (1), Ohio (1), Oregon (1), Rhode Island (1), Virginia (2), Costa Rica (1), Italy (1), and Japan (1).

Number of Job Offers

Of the 244 graduates that are currently employed full time, 134 (55%) received more than one job offer. This has stayed consistent with the Class of 2012. The number of employment offers received ranged from 1 to 4, with respondents receiving a mean of 1.80 job offers per graduate.

Relationship between Aeademie Major and Position Obtained

Of the 436 graduates that are employed, 283 (65%) told us how their occupation related to their major. Of those 283:

- 167 (59%) respondents indicated a direct relationship between their academic major and the position they obtained.
- 76 (27%) respondents indicated an indirect relationship between their academic major and the position they obtained.
- 40 (14%) respondents indicated there was no relationship between their academic major and the position they obtained.

Experiential Learning/Internship Participation

Of the 679 survey respondents, 408 (60%) indicated whether they had or had not participated in an internship or practicum experience during their undergraduate careers at TCNJ.

Of those 408 students, 196 (48%) indicated that they had participated in at least one internship. Of those 196 students, 116 (59%) indicated that they had participated in internships for two or more semesters, with an average of approximately 2 semesters per student. Of the 196 students that participated in at least one internship, 60 (31%) indicated that their internship experience secured them a job after graduation.

Additionally, 88 (22%) participated in student teaching, with 28 participating in two or more semesters. 26 (6%) participated in clinical placements, with 22 participating in two or more semesters. 19 (5%) participated in MUSE research, with 3 participating in two or more semesters. 91 (22%) participated in TCNJ sponsored research, with 59 participating in two or more semesters. 35 (9%) participated in non-TCNJ sponsored research, with 9 participating in two or more semesters.

Of the 679 survey respondents, 628 provided us with graduate school information. Of them, 165 (26%) indicated they attended graduate school within the first year. Through the Clearinghouse we learned that an additional 177 graduates attended graduate school within the first year, giving us a total of 342 students in graduate school (23% of the total graduating class).

Future Plans for Graduate Study

*Planned further study includes those who are currently enrolled in Graduate/Professional School and those who intend to go further than their current degrees.

Of the 679 survey respondents, 221 (33%) indicated whether or not they had plans for future graduate study. Their plans to attend graduates school and when are listed in the table below:

Of the 679 survey respondents, 422 (62%) indicated whether or not they had received advice from their primary faculty advisors about post-graduation planning. The type of advisement was as follows:

Of the 422 students, 347 (77%) indicated they had received advice from faculty regarding their post-graduation career plans. Of the 422 students, 362 (85%) indicated they had received advice from faculty on internships.

Of the 422 students, 324 (76%) indicated they had received advice from faculty on graduate or professional school options.

Usage of Career Services

Of the 679 survey respondents, 422 (62%) indicated that they had utilized the services provided by the Career Center during their academic careers. The services used are listed below:

- Of the 422 students, 320 (76%) indicated that they attended one or more Job Fairs/Career Days 92 (22%) did not use the service, 10 (2%) were not aware of it.
- Of the 422 students, 334 (79%) indicated that they utilized Career Resources - 72 (17%) did not use the service, 16 (4%) were not aware of it.
- Of the 422 students, 170 (40%) indicated that they attended one or more "Exploring Major and Careers" Workshops

- 86 (21%) did not use the service, 166 (39%) were not aware of it.

- Of the 422 students, 267 (63%) indicated that they utilized Internship Recruitment and Resources 102 (24%) did not use the service, 53 (13%) were not aware of it.
- Of the 422 students, 327 (77%) indicated that they utilized LionsLink and job listings - 84 (20%) did not use the service, 11 (3%) were not aware of it.
- Of the 422 students, 238 (56%) indicated that they attended on or more On-Campus Interviews - 137 (33%) did not use the service, 47 (11%) were not aware of it.
- Of the 422 students, 328 (78%) indicated that they utilized the Resume Critique service - 82 (20%) did not use the service, 12 (3%) were not aware of it.
- Of the 422 students, 160 (38%) indicated that they used the Dining Out in Professional Style program 187 (44%) did not use the service, 75 (18%) were not aware of it.
- Of the 422 students, 256 (61%) indicated that they experienced one or more workshops/class presentations 118 (28%) did not use the service, 48 (11%) were not aware of it.

Of the 422 students, 157 (37%) indicated that they participated in one or more Mock Interviews - 173 (41%) did not use the service, 92 (22%) were not aware of it.

Of the 422 students, 185 (44%) indicated that they utilized Graduate and Professional School programs - 179 (42%) did not use the service, 58 (14%) were not aware of it.

Of the 422 students, 246 (58%) indicated that they received individual major or career counseling - 114 (27%) did not use the service, 62 (15%) were not aware of it.

Satisfaction with Academic Experience

Of the 679 survey respondents, 393 (58%) reported their satisfaction with their academic experience at TCNJ based on a 5-point Likert scale (Poor = 1, Excellent = 5).
