TCNJ THE COLLEGE OF NEW JERSEY

62.6% of the Class of 2019 responded to the One Year Out Survey.

97.2% reported they are employed, continuing their education, or in the military.

57.3% full-time employed* **40.1%** continuing education **2.4%** part-time employed*, or military

Of 595 reporting employment, 593 indicated full or part time roles.

73 of 399 reporting continuing education received financial assistance.

32% full tuition

60% partial tuition

The average stipend amount:
