THE COLLEGE OF NEW JERSEY CLASS OF 2022 FIRST DESTINATION SUMMARY

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The following report details the post-graduation activity of The College of New Jersey's (TCNJ) Class of 2022, defined as individuals who were awarded a bachelor's degree in August 2021, December 2021, January 2022 and May 2022.

Data was available for 1,014/1,722 (58.9%) of Class of 2022 graduates. In alignment with the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE)¹, data were collected through self-reported information via Handshake's First Destination Survey (FDS) module, the National Student Clearinghouse provided by TCNJ's Institutional Research and Analytics, as well as from public record (LinkedIn). Graduates who reported prior to graduation that they were seeking opportunities, but did not provide a verifiable update during the survey collection period, are not included in the outcomes data reported. The percentage of the graduating class with known career outcomes is the knowledge rate. The term "knowledge rate", according to NACE, is used to defined the number of graduates for which an institution has reasonable and verifiable data concerning the post-graduation career activities.

Throughout this summary, data are presented on a college-wide level and by school. This year there were two (2) graduates who were officially conferred degrees under Interdisciplinary Studies. Their results are also broken out, where appropriate.

Knowledge Rate

The Class of 2022 consisted of 1722 bachelor's degree recipients based on official data provided by The Office of Records and Registration. Among these eligible graduates, we were able to secure data on 1014 or 58.9%.

Below is the knowledge rate breakdown by school.

Outcome Rate

The percentages in this section are based on the 1014 graduates for which we have data, and all 1014 graduates who recently were awarded their degrees had outcomes that span working, continuing education (graduate or professional school, or other continuing education program), volunteer service or military. This group with confirmed plans define the term "Outcome Rate". We opted to use the term "Continuing Education" to align with NACE Standards and Protocols for the Collection and Dissemination of Graduation Students Initial Career Outcomes Information for Undergraduates (2019). Accordingly, continuing education defines "those who have been accepted to and plan to matriculate into a program of further study. This includes graduate school or specialized training", (NACE, 2019, pg.7).

Primary Outcome

Class of 2022 graduates were asked to indicate their primary plans after graduation within the first year after graduation. Below is the breakdown of those plans across TCNJ as a whole, as well school based on the 1014 respondents. The term "working" refers to students indicating full-time or part-time employment, "continuing education" refers to students pursuing graduate or professional school, or further study (i.e. certificate), "military" refers to students pursuing military service, and "volunteer" refers to those participating in a volunteer or service program (i.e. Peace Corps of AmeriCorps).



Employer Industry Breakdown

Below is the breakdown of the 544 graduates reporting full-time employment and their employer's industry. The top industries include financial services, 19.3% (accounting, investment banking, insurance, and commercial banking); media & marketing, 9.9% (advertising, PR, marketing, design, journalism, media/publishing, sales); architecture, real estate and construction, 9.4% (architecture, planning, civil engineering, construction, engineering/construction, interior design, landscaping, real estate); education, 9.0% (K-12 education, higher education, and other education).
